Brief History Of DRE

- Los Angeles Police Department Early 1970s
- Officially Recognized by LAPD in 1979
- 1987-1988 Arizona, Colorado, New York,
 Virginia, Utah, California, Indiana
- 1989 Expanded Across the Country
- Currently 44 States have DRE Programs
- Program has Spread Worldwide

Montana DRE Program

- Began in Missoula 2002
- 2006
 - Montana Highway Patrol
 - Kalispell Police Department
 - Whitefish Police Department
 - Helena Police Department
- Currently 25 Certified DREs in Montana
 - 8 Agencies Active in DRE

Training

- 80 Hours Classroom
 - SFST Proficiencies
 - Physiology and Drugs
 - Drug Categories
 - Examination Of Vital Signs
 - 12 Step Process
- 12 Field Certifications
 - Subjects Under the Influence
 - 80% Proficiency Required

Certifications

- Final Knowledge Examination
 - Cumulative Test
 - 4-8 Hours to Complete
- 8 Hours Annual DRE Related Training
- 4 Confirmed Evaluations Every 2 Years
 - Must Be Supported By Toxicology
- Must Maintain 80% Proficiency Rate
- Recertify Every 2 Years
