### **COMMITTEE ACTION**

The Economic Affairs Interim Committee (EAIC):

- by consensus agreed to include in a draft bill for discussion purposes regulation of Montana State Fund by the State Auditor (Insurance Commissioner) and the following items from Exhibit 12:
  - A) retaining Montana State Fund as a guaranteed market;
  - B) retaining Montana State Fund eligibility for the federal tax exemption;
  - C) preventing Montana State Fund from being dissolved by the State Auditor;
  - L) allowing Montana State Fund to have a calendar, not fiscal budget year;
  - M) providing that a memorandum of understanding be allowed for Montana State Fund to have tiered rating;
  - N) allowing Montana State Fund (and all insurers) to use a higher experience rating trigger and all have the same class codes;
  - P) providing that Montana State Fund statutes be in Title 33, but with flexibility;
  - Q) providing that Montana State Fund receive an automatic certificate of approval.
- ! agreed unanimously that due diligence had been done as directed by House Bill No. 525 in the 2011 session and that the following boards would be recommended to be retained: the Alternative Health Care Board, Board of Architects and Landscape Architects, Board of Athletic Trainers, Board of Barbers and Cosmetologists, Board of Massage Therapy, Board of Occupational Therapy Practice, Board of Physical Therapy Examiners, Board of Private Security, Board of Real Estate Appraisers, Board of Realty Regulation, Board of Sanitarians, Board of Social Work Examiners and Professional Counselors, and the Board of Speech Language Pathologists and Audiologists.
