FR: Sonja Nowakowski RE: Program Evaluation

The evaluation of programs administered by the agency for which the ETIC has oversight is required by law. Over the decades, the fulfillment of this statute has ranged from an item on the agenda driven by a constituent concern, to updates on a topic at each meeting, to more complete evaluations that involve staff time and analysis.

The attached documents are intended to provide the ETIC the full menu of options for program evaluations. The accompanying spreadsheet provides a brief description of programs within the Public Service Commission that the ETIC may wish to evaluate.

What, if anything, the ETIC evaluates depends entirely on the staff resources and ETIC time that the committee devotes to each review. Also attached is a sheet that shows tasks that could be included in a minimum, medium, and full program review and a range of estimated staff time necessary to complete the tasks. The information has been incorporated into the work plan.

The intent of this more formalized planning process is to give the ETIC a picture of the variety of programs available for review and to allow for an in-depth and contextual review of a program, including applicable laws, rules, funding, and implementation. The selection of a program may be driven by a constituent anecdote, a piece of legislation, or a timely issue, but the program review would provide the ETIC with a broader picture.

Again, the attached documents are intended to provide the ETIC with a planning tool. The final decision on how reviews are conducted lies with the committee members.
