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9	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
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11	Section 1. Section 2-17-512, MCA, is amended to read:
12	"2-17-512. Powers and duties of department. (1) The department is responsible for carrying out the
13	planning and program responsibilities for information technology for state government, except the national guard.
14	The department shall:
15	(a) encourage and foster the development of new and innovative information technology within state
16	government;
17	(b) promote, coordinate, and approve the development and sharing of shared information technology
18	application software, management systems, and information that provide similar functions for multiple state
19	agencies;
20	(c) cooperate with the office of economic development to promote economic development initiatives
21	based on information technology;
22	(d) establish and enforce a state strategic information technology plan as provided for in 2-17-521;
23	(e) establish and enforce statewide information technology policies and standards;
24	(f) review and approve state agency information technology plans provided for in 2-17-523;
25	(g) coordinate with the office of budget and program planning to evaluate budget requests that include
26	information technology resources. The department shall make recommendations to the office of budget and
27	program planning for the approval or disapproval of information technology budget requests, including an
28	estimate of the useful life of the asset proposed for purchase and whether the amount should be expensed or
29	capitalized, based on state accounting policy established by the department. An unfavorable recommendation
30	must be based on a determination that the request is not provided for in the approved agency information
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30	(2) If it is in the state's best interest, the department may contract with qualified private organizations,

6	"2-17-513. Duties of board. The board shall:
7	(1) provide a forum to:
8	(a) guide state agencies, the legislative branch, the judicial branch, and local governments in the
9	development and deployment of intergovernmental information technology resources;
10	(b) share information among state agencies, local governments, and federal agencies regarding the
11	development of information technology resources;
12	(2) advise the department:
13	(a) in the development of cooperative contracts for the purchase of information technology resources;
14	(b) regarding the creation, management, and administration of electronic government services and
15	information on the internet;
16	(c) regarding the administration of electronic government services contracts;
17	(d) on the priority of government services to be provided electronically;
18	(e) on convenience fees prescribed in 2-17-1102 and 2-17-1103, if needed, for electronic government
19	services; and
20	(f) on any other aspect of providing electronic government services;
21	(3) review and advise the department on:
22	(a) statewide information technology standards and policies;
23	(b) the state strategic information technology plan;
24	(c) major information technology budget requests;
25	(d) rates and other charges for services established by the department as provided in $2-17-512(1)(t)$;
26	(e) requests for exceptions as provided for in 2-17-515;
27	(f) notification of proposed exemptions by the university system and office of public instruction as
28	provided for in 2-17-516;
29	(g) action taken by the department as provided in 2-17-514(1) for any activity that is not in compliance
30	with this part;

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1	(h) the implementation of major information technology projects and advise the respective governing
2	authority of any issue of concern to the board relating to implementation of the project; and
3	(i) financial reports, management reports, and other data as requested by the department;
4	(4) study state government's present and future information technology needs and advise the department
5	on the use of emerging technology in state government;
6	(5) request information and reports that it considers necessary from any entity using or having access
7	to the statewide telecommunications network or central computer center;
8	(6) assist in identifying, evaluating, and prioritizing potential departmental and interagency electronic
9	government services;
10	(7) serve as a central coordination point for electronic government services provided by the department
11	and other state agencies; and
12	(8) study, propose, develop, or coordinate any other activity in furtherance of electronic government
13	services as requested by the governor or the legislature; and
14	(9) prepare and submit to the state administration and veterans' affairs interim committee by September
15	15 in the year preceding the regular legislative session and in the manner provided in 5-11-210 a report including
16	but not necessarily limited to a summary of the board's activities, a review of the electronic government program
17	established under part 11 of this chapter, and any key findings and recommendations that the board presented
18	to the department."
