

Community College Funding Formula


Expenditures (excluding personnel services) per Total FTE



- The community colleges have different non-personnel services expenditures in FY 2019
 - Dawson Community College \$1.8 million
 - Flathead Valley Community College -\$3.0 million
 - Miles Community College \$1.4 million
- When comparing expenditures (excluding personnel services) per FTE, smaller campuses have higher expenditures per total FTE than larger campuses


State Support per Resident FTE






^{*}The solid lines on this chart assume that the current formula projected FTE as they actually occurred in each fiscal year






Flathead Valley Community College Funding Formula Comparison


