- Maximize public safety by reserving detention for those offenders who pose the greatest risk to reoffend or fail to appear in court.
- Maximize court appearance.
- Maximize the appropriate use of release and detention by use of services designed to fulfill the two goals stated above

Data is collected using the AutoMon case management system. The data still contains "noise" and will continue to need refinement. (<i>Please note that percentages were rounded and may not add to 100%</i>)
The attached report captured all cases closed in <u>Butte Silver Bow, Lake, Lewis and Clark, Missoula, and Yellowstone counties</u> between January 1, 2019 and December 31, 2021. During that time-period, 8,340 or 77% of the Public Safety Assessment-related cases were closed.
About 76% or 6,379 defendants were released pre-trial from detention. Of those, about 60% were released on their own recognizance. The other 38% had some form of cash bail required for release.
Of the defendants not released pre-trial, 21% were a level 1 on the PSA, 39% were a level 2, and 40% were a level 3.
For defendants released pre-trial, 79% reported to their court appearances. (**Please note this reflects cases in which a warrant was issued for the failure to appear. If a defendant did not appear but a warrant was not issued, it is not counted as it doesn't exist in the database.)
In the closed cases, 75% of the defendants remained law-abiding. 737 people were arrested for new misdemeanors and 878 for new felonies. 454 of these were violent offenses.
The OCA does not maintain or collect county jail data. Thus, it is difficult to assess the impact on overall jail populations, which include not only pre-trial defendants, but people convicted who are awaiting a Department of Corrections placement, serving a misdemeanor sentencing, or awaiting the outcome of a probation violation. Several detention facilities also house federal inmates.
